



The New Hampshire Maple Experience

The Rocks Estate now offers a year-round maple education experience. Participants will enjoy an interactive virtual tour of the actual sap boiling process in the new sugarhouse and maple museum. Learn how this sweetest of treats was made from the times of Native Americans to present day.

This program is held in one of the original turn-of-the-century buildings on the property. Formerly the sawmill/pigpen for the farm, this building is being remodeled to house this year-round Maple Education Center. The Society for the Protection of New Hampshire Forests, which owns the Rocks, is working in collaboration with the New Hampshire Maple Museum to renovate and create this unique educational experience.

Also featured will be a rotating display of maple producing artifacts, from wooden buckets and spouts, to maple sugar molds and evaporators.

This tour also features a unique photo opportunity when participants pass from one section of this historic building to the second. Framed within this section are the mountains of the Presidential Range.
